This will be my final update before the Inquiry panel presents our report to the Government.

The Government has agreed to my request for a one month extension for delivery of the report from 31 October to 30 November 2018.

The Panel is committed to presenting a quality report that will set a clear direction for the future of mental health and addiction in Aotearoa New Zealand.

The extra time will ensure we can do justice to the volume of submissions – over 5,500 – and the volume of information we've gathered over the course of the Inquiry. This includes the extensive reflections and ideas many of you have shared with us at over 400 meetings since we started our work in February.

Our focus now is on producing the Inquiry report. When the report is complete we will deliver it to the Minister of Health. The Government will then decide what actions they will take on the report release and its recommendations.
